

**REPLACE FENCING ON ATHLETIC FIELDS
AT
MARINE CORPS AIR STATION
CHERRY POINT, NORTH CAROLINA 28533-0006
WORK REQUEST # 4645437**

1. GENERAL INTENTION: It is the declared and acknowledged intention of this solicitation to obtain the supervision, expertise, labor, materials, and equipment to accomplish the replacement of the fencing at the athletic fields.

2. LOCATION: The work is located at the following athletic ball fields: 3159, 3192, 3193, 4394, 4395, and 4420.

3. DETAILED REQUIREMENTS: The contractor shall:

a. Familiarize himself with the area requiring work by making a site visit. The contractor shall perform his own inspection of each replacement item, take his own measurements and develop his own materials requirements, in accordance with specifications to repair and leave operational the listed items in the contract.

b. Be responsible for all contractor related damages to government property during the performance of this contract.

c. It shall be understood that it is the responsibility of the contractor to set-up, place, position, and remove all appropriate safety work area signs, barricades, caution tape, ladders, scaffolding, and personnel protection.

4. SCOPE OF WORK: The Contractor shall:

a. Remove and dispose of all fencing fabric on fields 3159 (Little League Field), 3193 (White Field), 4394 (Blue Field), 4395 (Red Field), and 4420 (Gold Field), including dugouts and the backstop area.

b. Remove and dispose of fencing from on the Baseball Field. Only remove the fencing between the two dugouts, including the backstop area.

c. Install new fencing fabric where existing fencing was required to be removed. New fencing shall be 9 gauge galvanized steel except as follows: the vertical backstops on the White, Blue, Red, Gold and the Baseball field shall be 6 gauge galvanized steel. An appropriate gauge tension wire shall be installed at the bottom of all new fencing where applicable.

d. Remove and reinstall any existing signs on the fencing.

e. On all fields where fencing is to be replaced, straighten and/or replace any misaligned or bent line posts, replace or reinstall all missing or loose connection poles, and adjust all gates for proper operation.

4. SCOPE OF WORK: (cont)

f. Install new shade screen fabric on the dugouts of the White, Blue, Red, and Gold Fields. Fabric shall be equal to or better than "Superscreen" product sold by Signature Fencing & Flooring Systems @ www.outfieldfencing.com. Fabric shall be sewn with a hem edge with eyelets for installation. Fabric shall cover the entire top and shall cover an area four feet down from the top on the back and end of each dugout. Fabric shall be forest green in color.

g. Remove and dispose of all fence top protectors on the White, Blue, Red, and Gold Fields.

h. Install new fence top protectors where existing protectors were required to be removed on the White, Blue, Red, and Gold Field. Also install new fence top protectors on the Little League field on all six foot high fencing and gates. Fence top protectors shall be equal to or better than the "Fence Topper" product sold by Signature Fencing & Flooring Systems @ www.outfieldfencing.com. Fence top protectors shall be yellow in color.

i. Raise the dugout bench seats on the Blue and White fields to a height of 18".

5. TERMS OF CONTRACT: The contractor shall:

a. Commence work under this contract within thirty (30) working days after receipt of notice of award or any other communication authorizing the contractor to proceed.

b. All work performed shall be during the hours of 0700-1600, Monday through Friday.

c. Prosecute the work diligently, and complete the work within sixty (60) working days.

d. Unless otherwise specified, all labor and material shall have a one year warranty.

6. JOB EXECUTION: The contractor shall perform all work and incorporate the intent of this project as outlined in this scope of work. The contractor shall coordinate thru the Contracting Officer to minimize the impact on the tenant's schedule. Unless otherwise noted, all equipment and debris generated from this project becomes the property of the contractor. The contractor must remove all equipment and debris from the job site and MCAS Cherry Point, at no expense to the government.

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Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

In the listing above, the "SU" designation means that rates listed under the identifier do not reflect collectively bargained wage and fringe benefit rates. Other designations indicate unions whose rates have been determined to be prevailing.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:
